

TROOP 150 BAGGING POLICIES

The Highlights

PROPER BAGGING – All youth members of the Troop shall read the instructions for bagging and shall sign the form indicating he has read the instructions.

SCOUT UNIFORM – Scouts and Adult Leaders shall wear their most complete Class-A uniform including the official BSA shirt, official pants or shorts, official belt, and Troop 150 neckerchief. Do not wear merit badge sashes, OA sashes, or hats.

Scouts and adults without Class-A uniforms shall wear the yellow Troop 150 T-Shirt with shorts or pants (jeans or casual-dress) that are neat in appearance. T-Shirts and shirts are always to be worn tucked in at the waist.

Do not wear stickers, name tags, or pins that represent any business. T-Shirts and shirts are always to be worn tucked in at the waist. Wear athletic style shoes or other shoes that are neat in appearance and comfortable.

SNACKS/DRINKS – Eat a meal before showing up to bag. Snacks or drinks may be permitted if time allows and shall not be consumed in direct view of customers.

BREAKS – The adults may allow short breaks as the workload permits. Bathroom breaks can be taken at any time.

LEAVING THE BAGGING AREA – Scouts and adults should let someone know that they are leaving the area and when they will return. Scouts must be accompanied by a buddy, unless taking bags to a customer's car. An adult shall supervise when a Scout takes bags to a customer's car.

FAMILY & FRIENDS – Only those on the schedule should be in the bagging area. Adults should leave other children at home as they present distractions for everyone and create a liability for the store.

TOTAL HOURS WORKED IN ONE DAY – Scouts shall not be scheduled for more than one shift per day until all other Scouts have an opportunity to get on the schedule that day. Once everyone has an opportunity to get on the schedule, Scouts may volunteer for an additional shift, except no Scout should schedule himself to cover more than six hours in any one day.

ILLNESS/LEAVING EARLY/CHANGING SCHEDULE – If you are too ill to bag or unable to keep your scheduled time, contact the Fundraising Chairman (FC), Scoutmaster (SM), or Troop Committee Chairman (TCC).

TRACKING BAGGING HOURS – Only adults shall annotate the times that each person arrives and departs. If you begin bagging more than five minutes late, your start time will show you as 15 minutes late.

CELL PHONES/ELECTRONIC GAMES/BOOKS/MAGAZINES – Scouts are not permitted to have cell phones, electronic games, books, magazines, or other reading material.

MONEY – Scouts shall not empty the cans or move money from one can to another. The adult handling the money is the only person that should make change, sell change to the store, separate, count, band, or roll the change. This should be done in an area not directly in view of the customers.

ADULT LEADERS & PARENTS – The adults are in charge and Scouts should show all parents and other adults the same respect and courtesies they show the SM. Adults have the authority to send a Scout home early for misbehavior, including making generally negative comments. If serious misbehavior occurs the SM will be notified immediately.

HAVING FUN – The most important thing to remember is to have fun!
